DEA Diversion Control Division Hosts Supply Chain Conference

More than 700 DEA registered manufacturers, distributors, pharmacists, importers, and exporters attended the Supply Chain Conference both in-person and virtually in Little Rock, Arkansas this month.



Assistant Administrator Thomas Prevoznik opened the conference by addressing the important role that these registrants play in preventing the diversion of controlled substances.

The conference provided a venue for representatives from the supply chain industry to engage in discussions concerning existing federal regulations, regulatory changes, and DEA policy. The development of initiatives to

reduce the diversion of pharmaceutical controlled substances while ensuring an adequate and uninterrupted supply was a key focus.
